### WHY IT MATTERS

Property taxes in Ohio have increased significantly, largely due to a complex local government structure of more than 3,900 taxing authorities.

Reform is needed to lower property taxes.



#### **EMPOWER COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**

Requiring commissioners to approve all local levies—except school levies—to appear on the ballot will ensure a more comprehensive financial assessment for residents.

#### LIMIT CORPORATE PROPERTY TAX BREAKS

Too often government grants significant tax breaks to large corporations shifting the tax burdens to families and small businesses.





#### SPEND STATE TAX DOLLARS ON CRITICAL NEEDS

State policymakers should allocate funds to local governments for needs, such as infrastructure or crises.

## SHARE STATE TAX DOLLARS WITH LOCAL COMMUNITIES IN DIRE NEED

State tax dollars should be used for local governments that struggle to provide essential services due to limited tax bases.





#### **EXPANDING SHARED SERVICES**

Local governments can save costs and improve services by pooling resources.

#### **CONSOLIDATE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ENTITIES**

Consolidating local governments reduces redundancies, enhances efficiency, and saves taxpayer dollars.
